Primary Year Programme

The PYP marks the start of a lifelong journey. It develops caring and culturally aware children aged 6 – 12 to become active participants in their own learning.

- First Step: All students to meet age criteria as per local government act
- Second Step: Admission Counselor Interacts with the parents
- Third Step: School checks Previous year's Assessment Record ((please refer to Annexure1 for further details)
- Final Step: Parents and student interaction with the PYP Coordinator.

We provide admission to all students. In case of severe learning needs we offer suggestions to parents to support the child with a support teacher, the students are also then supported by our Special Needs Educator.

We as a school support the students in developing their Social Skills, Self Management skills and to an extent Communication Skill. For developing their Cognitive Skills the Special Needs Educator collaborates (basically puts up suggestions) with the parent, Home room teacher and the support teacher.

Students are expected to complete entrance tests for English, Science and Math to judge their cognitive skills which will help the teachers to bridge the gap of a child's learning. We as a school ensure that for every application received, admission procedures are followed in a fair and transparent manner.

Middle Year Programme

The MYP is a challenging framework that encourages students aged 11 to 16 to make practical connections between their studies and the real world, preparing them for success in further study and in life.

- First Step: All students to meet age criteria
- Second Step: Admission Counselor Interacts with the parents
- Third Step: School checks Previous year's Assessment Record (please refer to Annexure1 for further details)
- Fourth Step: Parents and student interaction with the MYP Coordinator.

We provide admission to all students. In case of severe learning needs we offer suggestions to parents to support the child with a Support teacher, the students are also then supported by our Special Needs Educator. We as a school support the students in developing their Social Skills. For

Diploma Programme

COIS offers the International Baccalaureate Diploma Program for students in Grades 11 and 12. The IB program is open to all students, regardless of previous educational experience.

A student who decides to participate in the IB Program, as a Diploma candidate will be expected to:

- work very hard
- approach tasks with a sense of purpose and maintain academic integrity
- demonstrate self-discipline and responsibility
- · learn from fellow students as well as teachers
- · Share with, and contribute to, the community.

Enrolment into Grades 11 & 12

Admission to the International Baccalaureate Diploma Programme is dependent upon the demonstration of ability to cope with the demands of a very challenging course. Scholarships are available for students of outstanding potential. The normal expectation of potential IBDP students is a proven academic record and the demonstration of commitment to make a positive contribution to the COIS community.

For external students:

Students who have completed MYP5 from an external school need to submit their IB Certificate. The admission to DP and subject selection will be provisional. The school management will review the subject choice based on the past performance of the child in internal exams (if any). Candidates, who have done MYP but have not participated in any external exam, should have completed MYP Personal Project satisfactorily and should produce results of MYP Personal Project.

Students of grade 10 from CBSE, Cambridge, State or any other board (External Students) should have a grade 10 mark sheet stating that the child has cleared the exam and is eligible to study grade 11 (please refer to Annexure1 for further details) Following that interaction of the child along with the parents with Diploma Programme Coordinator and the Head of School.

As per school language policy, students will be offered a choice of languages as Language B.

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For Internal students:

All students from COIS, who have successfully completed MYP will be eligible to get admission in the Diploma Programme.

Subject selection:

The applicant can choose the subjects in the DP on the basis of IB subjects he/she has taken. Students will also have one to one interaction with DP subject teachers. On the basis of interaction with DP coordinator and DP subjects teachers, students and his parents will be assisted in making appropriate subject selections depending on the potential of the child, his subject interest. If required, the child may be required to write an aptitude / admission test to decide his suitability for the subject.

Annexure1 to step 3:

During the admissions process, applicants will need to provide complete documentation of their academic history, educational evaluations, and details of extra academic or specialist support they have had or are currently receiving (evaluation reports, individualized learning plans or individualized education plans, documentation of diagnosis, etc.). This is in accordance with the 'COIS Admissions Policy'.

COIS expects families to disclose evaluation reports (educational, psychological, speech, occupational therapy etc.) or documentation that informs if a student is to receive additional services in class. Please notice that COIS is currently not able to admit students who use a wheelchair as the specifications of our buildings do not allow us to do so.

The Admission Policy of Calorx Olive International School considers learners with mild to moderate learning difficulties and will not reject the admission of child only on the grounds of SEN however, it shall be at the discrete of the management to decide.

ADMISSIONS SCREENING PROCESS:

All students applying for admission to Calorx Olive International School are assessed to determine current levels of performance in literacy and numeracy. The Calorx Olive International School Admissions team analyzes previous school records and information given by the parents to determine the potential need for Learning Support.

The former school of every new student is asked to forward any details of Learning Support provided in addition to all appropriate testing results that are available. Calorx Olive International may also request a statement of medical history, including any significant health, social and/or emotional needs, and information on additional services currently (or previously) provided. The final decision is taken when the above-mentioned documents are discussed by a specialist team comprising of the Counsellor, Primary School Coordinator / Secondary School Coordinator and Head of School.

The authenticity of the documents is an important deciding factor in the final admission. Any student identified as potentially needing Learning Support with a diagnostic report, should be assessed by the School Counsellor or Learning Support Teacher and a report will be given to

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Admissions with details from findings and with recommendations. The learning needs of students and the diagnosis are discussed with the Learning Support team, school management, and other relevant staff. Parents are then informed if the school can meet the needs of the student
